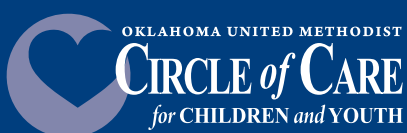

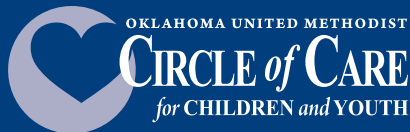

PEARL'S HOPE GIVES MOTHER OF TWO A FRESH START

Kimberly is a single mother of Makenna (18) and Carsten (5). She and her family currently live at the Pearl's Hope Transitional Living program in Tulsa. She moved to Pearl's Hope from a rehabilitation facility and is now working on future goals and dreams.

Kim grew up as an only child in a small town near the Texas border. She was raised in a family suffering from drug and alcohol abuse.

"When I would see my family using, I would tell myself I would never do that. But eventually I fell into the same addictive habits they suffered from," said Kim.

After battling alcoholism for 15 years, Kim decided enough was enough.

"I came to Tulsa to restart my life and to never fall into addiction again." said Kim. "Having a support system is very important for recovering addicts. It keeps us accountable and gives us the opportunity to believe in ourselves."

Although Kimberly is new to the program, she feels she has learned a lot of valuable information in a short amount of time.

"I am so blessed by this program. I am going to learn as much as I can during the time I am here. I am so thankful and grateful to have been chosen to be here. It's such a blessing," said Kim.

Since Kim has been in the program she has completed some job training courses and is now a certified administrative assistant. She has also completed technology courses as well as learned some professional development skills.

"Before I graduate from the program, I want to save up for a car, find safe and secure housing as well as a lifelong profession," said Kimberly.

The program offers women finance, parenting, and nutrition courses. The structure and stability of the program along with mentorship make it possible for the women to learn and grow as mothers.

"My faith is very strong and I believe God led me here. God has everything to do with my life right now," said Kim. "All the girls in the house are like my family. We have grown together so much and encourage each other all the time. I feel like I couldn't have been this successful without Pearl's Hope."

We've Only Just Begun

Three Hundred and Sixty-Five days!!! Has it really been that long since I wrote my first article as Board Chair? Yes, and this is so cliché, but I can't believe it. Also cliché is that "we've accomplished so much" this past year. But, what can I say...we have.

Our 100th Anniversary celebration and the inception of the capital campaign for the foster homes were the first two big events that began the year. We knew when this campaign started that churches would want to help and have foster care for their areas. Since "word" started leaking out about possible locations for the foster care homes, requests have been phenomenal. We heard from churches all across the state.

Alva took the "bull by the horns" and headed its own fundraising efforts to partner with us on one home. As this article goes to print, the home is just weeks away from opening its doors to serve our sweet, sweet children in sibling sets. We'll be able to serve up to 6 children in that home.

A second home is being added to the Holsinger Home site in Enid. We're building a club house on that property as well for training, recruiting and family events. With two foster homes on the Holsinger site, we'll be able to serve up to 12 children there.

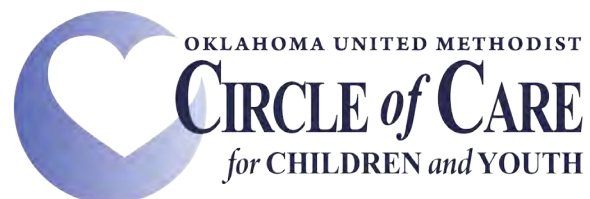
Other churches have located land for possible foster care homes. So much paper work is required to even begin construction, and it takes weeks or months for that to happen. We're so joyful the response has been so awe-inspiring.

Our very own president-emeritus Donald Batson has taken the lead with the fund-raising, meeting with churches, community leaders, and construction managers, keeping the projects on target to finish in a timely fashion. His knowledge and help with this campaign have been the agency's safe-guard in making certain all "i's" are dotted and all "t's" are crossed.

Our new President, Keith Howard, is already making a difference in such a positive way. We made a great hire when we asked him to take on the responsibility of Circle of Care.

In your very own communities, you probably see the desperate need for foster care and keeping sibling sets together. We need your help in making the final push on raising the remaining \$1.8 million to complete the \$5 million capital campaign project. So much to be done, so many people needed to help. Will you join the effort to make these much-needed homes a reality for generations to come? We've only just begun!
